How long have you lived in the city








Liveability: Annual gap trend












- 'Community' theme was mentioned 225 times, with focus on increasing/improving community events (specifically youth events), events/entertainment, supporting further community engagement, and improving community facilities
- 'Housing/cost of living/rent' was a top 3 concern with 163 mentions, with concerns focusing on housing availability, insurance costs
- 'Town' was mentioned 84 times, generally in reference to town facilities, appearance, and services; also transitioning from 'mining town' to 'liveable city'
- Crime, antisocial behavior, theft, stealing, and security made up 127 of the responses, which is considerably less than in 2022
- There is a clear desire for more community facilities and services, specifically childcare as well as increasing business/retail diversity


